Keep your e-mail safe!

Are you up-to-date on the latest terminology for Phishing? Know how scammers are trying to take advantage of you and stay safe!!

Phishing

Phishing schemes often use spoofing techniques to lure you in and get you to take the bait. These scams are designed to trick you into giving information to criminals that they shouldn't have access to.

In a phishing scam, you might receive an email that appears to be from a legitimate business and is asking you to update or verify your personal information by replying to the email or visiting a website. The web address might look similar to one you've used before. The email may be convincing enough to get you to take the action requested.

But once you click on that link, you're sent to a spoofed website that might look nearly identical to the real thing—like your bank or credit card site—and asked to enter sensitive information like passwords, credit card numbers, banking PINs, etc. **These fake websites are used solely to steal your information.**

Phishing has evolved and now has several variations that use similar techniques:

- **Vishing** scams happen over the phone, voice email, or VoIP (voice over Internet Protocol) calls.
- **Smishing** scams happen through SMS (text) messages.
- **Pharming** scams happen when malicious code is installed on your computer to redirect you to fake websites.



Weakness, cold or clammy skin, delirium, fatigue, nausea or vomiting, headache and convulsions. Have the symptoms? Get out of the heat and to an emergency room or urgent care right away! Left untreated, heatstroke can lead to permanent medical problems, or death.



Maryland's "Tax Free Week" begins on Sunday, August 11th and runs through Saturday, August 17th.

Maryland Tax-Free Week is a seven-day period during which the state offers a reprieve from sales tax on certain eligible items. It was initially established to assist families with the financial burden of back-to-school shopping, enabling them to purchase essential items without incurring additional costs associated with sales tax. The initiative has grown in popularity over the years, attracting not only parents and students but also bargain hunters looking to capitalize on significant savings.

During Maryland Tax-Free Week, the following items are eligible for exemption from the state's 6% sales tax:

Clothing and Footwear: All qualifying apparel priced at \$100 or less per item will be tax-free. This category includes a wide range of items, such as shirts, pants, dresses, shoes, coats, hats, and more. Whether you're searching for trendy back-to-school outfits for family members, or just refreshing your wardrobe, this is the perfect time to shop without the added tax burden.

The First \$40 of a Backpack: The first \$40 of a backpack's purchase price is exempt from sales tax, allowing you to save on both fashion and functionality.

If you don't feel like cooking be sure to turn to these places for good senior dining deals. From fast food to steak restaurants, our compiled restaurant list will definitely help you make your choice.

Keep in mind that deals may vary at participating locations and can change without notice.

- McDonald's: discounts on coffee and beverages (55+)
- Wendy's: get free coffee or other discounts depending on location
- **IHOP**: 10% discount (55+) and a menu for people aged 55 and over at participating locations
- **Golden Corral**: Senior discount varies by location (Inquire)
- **Denny's**: Offers a 55+ menu with smaller portions, and better prices.
- **Perkins**: Restaurants: Fifty-Five Plus menu Offers special deals (55+)
- **Subway**: 10% off (60+) varies by location
- Old Country Buffet: Daily discounts for seniors (55+)
- **Burger King**: 10% discount on purchase depending on location (60+)
- Long John Silver's: 10% discount or discounted beverage (55+)


